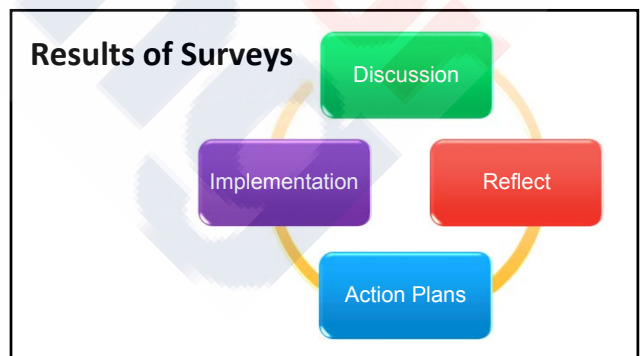

Action Plan

Date: March 20, 2017

Describe the area or item that needs to be improved: 80% of parents surveyed reported that they are not all of their participation ideas that accommodate parent schedules.

Strategy: Host a "volunteer fair" for parents to sign up for participation opportunities. Exclude a range of activities that should be done during the school day and activities that could be done by the parent at home to support the program.

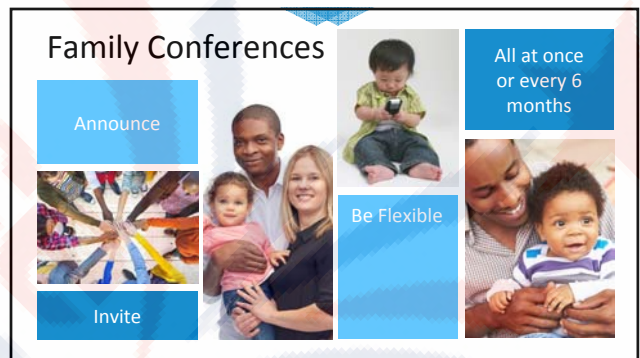
